Firearm Dealer Certification Act

The Combating Illegal Gun Trafficking Act requires Federal Firearms License holders to be certified in Illinois. This certification will implement best business practices to help reduce guns entering the illegal market and allow state and local law enforcement to crack down on corrupt dealers.

THE PROBLEM

- Gun Dealers are the most critical link between gun manufacturers and the public. **They're also one of the largest sources of illegally trafficked firearms in the nation.**¹
- Federal law requires anyone engaged in the business of dealing firearms to have a license from ATF. However, loopholes in federal law enable dealers to engage in illegal business practices and fly under the radar. ATF lacks the necessary resources and legal authority to go after these negligent gun dealers.
- Chicago recovers 6 times as many guns per capita as New York City, and 1.5x as many guns per capita as Los Angeles. Both New York State and California have enacted State Gun Dealer Regulations.²
- Recent research indicates that 40% of guns used in crimes between 2013 and 2016 came from Illinois gun dealers.³


THE SOLUTION

The Firearm Dealer Certification Act gives Illinois the ability to encourage better business practices and hold corrupt dealers accountable. It will help curb a major source of illegally trafficked firearms from entering our communities by enforcing:

- **Background Checks for Licensees & Employees:** Gun store employees often have access to huge inventories of guns and it is a common sense practice to require that dealers and their employees are as responsible as the buyers.
- **Transparency and Accountability:** Upon certification, dealers would have their places of business open for inspection by Illinois State Police (ISP) and law enforcement during hours of operation.
- **Training:** The legislation would require training to ensure that dealers and their employees know how to conduct background checks, identify and stop straw purchases, and properly store guns to prevent thefts.
- **Security Requirements to Protect Our Communities:** industrywide best practices by requiring video security for brick and mortar locations and requiring that a copy of every purchaser's FOID or ID card be kept on record.
- **Safe Business Location Requirements:** The law would prevent the business of any new licensee from being within 500 feet of any school or be in violation of any local ordinance.
